I thank Qeios magazine for the opportunity to review the article "Developing Engineering Education Universities in India".

After careful reading and analysis, I would like to contribute the following comments:

1. The title of the article should be changed, as other reviewers have already noted, as it does not provide enough information or attract the reader.
2. The article is almost entirely descriptive. At times, it looks more like a strategic plan than an academic article.
3. The text is distributed across many topics that do not dialogue with each other, but merely juxtapose information.
4. There is no clear research problem and well-defined aims.
5. There is no explicit theoretical foundation that supported the discussion.
6. The methodology presents action research, but the text does not describe how the research with these characteristics was developed.
7. Final Considerations must reflect what the research contributed in relation to the proposed aims.

There is a lot of information, undoubtedly interesting for the reader, but from an academic point of view, I consider that, in order to be published, the text needs to be rewritten, presenting a clear problem and objectives, consistent theoretical and methodological foundation, discussion of the findings, and pertinent Final Considerations.
