The huge amount of data processed, analyzing the selected studies, offers a clear overview of the remaining symptoms years after the pandemic.

This information can also be useful for our group, which is interested in taste and smell loss in COVID-19 patients. It is pretty weird, for example, that these neurosensitive alterations are not reported in all the selected reviews, but, when reported, their prevalence is relatively high.

It is suggested by the authors that the variability of the reported symptoms can be related to the different viral subvariants or the different populations considered. It is worth deepening the study in the future.
