The importance of online group work in the post-COVID world, where online work is the norm rather than the exception, is significant.

"Participants' ages ranged between 21 to 46 years with a mean age of (M= 22.06, SD= 5.048)". 46-year-old undergraduate?

Samples should be from the same year, as different years might have different perceptions of online work. Senior students who did online work during the peak COVID period, where it was necessary, might have different perceptions of online work compared to newer students in the post-COVID world, where it is not necessary.
