Recommendations

The manuscript, with some revisions, has the potential to be a pivotal resource in understanding and addressing the challenges faced by indigenous communities during global health crises. Its emphasis on empirical data, combined with a strong theoretical underpinning, provides a robust platform for further research and policy formulation.

The qualitative approach is suitable for the depth of exploration required in understanding indigenous experiences. The selection of 45 informants based on their relevance to the research objectives is adequately justified, although the paper would benefit from a more detailed description of the interview process and any measures taken to ensure the reliability and validity of the gathered data.

- 1. **Enhance the Abstract**: Include more details on the methodology and principal findings to give a clearer preview of the study.
- 2. **Refine the Results Presentation**: Use more direct quotes and detailed narratives to bring the voice of the indigenous communities to the forefront.
- 3. **Tighten the Discussion**: Strengthen the linkage between theoretical frameworks and the empirical data.
- 4. **Expand the Conclusion**: Offer specific policy recommendations based on the study's findings.
