

Review of: "[Perspective] Combatting Relative Sea-Level Rise at a Global Scale: Presenting the International Panel on Land Subsidence (IPLS)"

The study (perspective) proposed by Dr. Minderhoud and colleagues introduces an important initiative (IPLS) to address land subsidence on a global scale. The topic is timely and relevant, given the increasing impact of land subsidence on relative sea-level rise. However, before its potential publication, some points need to be addressed. Addressing these points will probably strengthen the contribution to the field.

Comments:

- 1. How does the IPLS differentiate itself from existing initiatives like the UNESCO International Initiative on Land Subsidence? More clarity on the unique contribution of IPLS is necessary in a revised version of the paper.
- 2. Could you please provide more specific details on how the IPLS will develop its projections of coastal land elevation change? What methodologies will be employed?
- 3. More quantitative data on the current and projected impacts of land subsidence on relative sea-level rise is necessary.
- 4. Please provide more details on specific strategies the IPLS will employ to engage governments and policymakers, particularly in developing countries where the impact may be most severe.
- 5. I suggest adding another figure (or perhaps a table) that illustrates the current state of land subsidence globally, which would help contextualize the need for the IPLS.
- 6. It would be useful if the authors could provide a more specific timeline for implementing the IPLS initiatives in the conclusion section.
