An interesting article on gingival growth in a patient with an immune-mediated disease using immunosuppressants. The work presents good theoretical argumentation, reviewing the medications that cause drug-induced gingival hyperplasia, but it lacked some relevant clinical information to make a definitive diagnosis about the relationship between the medication and gingival hyperplasia. It missed the research on systemic diseases that could lead to this growth, such as granulomatosis. The authors should consider suggesting the use of the medication as a possible cause of gingival growth, rather than stating it categorically. I believe that if systemic conditions are excluded, the use of the medication can be related to this growth. The most interesting point of the article is the use of surgical LASER, a new technology in dentistry, which the authors should explore the benefits of its use. The article should be revised so that the above considerations can be reviewed by the authors. Best regards, Juliana Franco.
