This article is inadequate and should not be published. Notwithstanding the grammatical errors in writing, which can be edited, the article is descriptive in its intent and quite repetitive. It notes that the entry of women into militaries worldwide has increased. But it does not explain why this is important or relevant. Moreover, the increase in the participation of women in militaries has happened only in culturally western countries, and the article does not extend its analysis to explain why women are not breaking the same barriers elsewhere globally. The only example, and a weak one, is that of India. The research methodology and design are inadequate and should in fact be removed from the paper entirely, since the authors acknowledge that this is a review of secondary data. The main problem with the article is that without a research question, there is no clear line of argument. And second, the authors do not elaborate on why their observations are relevant and impactful.
