In the research method, microscopic examination was only carried out with 10x and 40x objectives. Microscopic examination of protozoa should use a 100x objective so that the morphological characteristics of Giardia lamblia are clearly visible. So, was it clear to identify the protozoa under 40x objectives of the microscope? Stool samples used in the research need to be explained: how were they prepared? Did the author use fresh feces or feces with fixatives?

The research results should be accompanied by a photo of Giardia lamblia from microscopic examination.
