- 1. The review is relevant, bearing in mind that inducing enzymes could be safer than inhibiting enzymes. However, the manuscript requires critical revision.
- 2. Abstract should be rewritten to include background, methods of gathering the information, summary of key findings, and conclusion.
- 3. So many equations contained in the manuscript require critical revision. Equations 1-9 are quite insufficient; hence, they do not represent enzyme inhibition theory in a real biological environment.
- 4. Specific examples in relation to inhibiting enzymes and biological reactions should have been given. Therefore, inhibition parameters are not adequately linked with other parameters. Kindly refer to the publication by Saganuwan SA, "Application of modified Michaelis-Menten equations for determination of enzyme inducing and inhibiting drugs."
- 5. The content of the manuscript is grossly inadequate. Kindly refer to many other publications to improve the write-up.

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
