An interesting topic and the abstract nicely state the research. Unfortunately, this was not reflected in the text.

- In citing an article with more than 2 authors, use the first author's last name and et al. followed by the year. There is no need to cite the names of the other authors except in the reference section. Do that throughout the text and be consistent.

- Always refer to older dated articles before the recent ones. Be consistent throughout.

- In the literature review, there is no need to repeat the introduction about using fossil fuels. Proceed to the topic of the bamboo plant, how much is there, and what % is used, and the waste generated by these industries - can this waste be used and not waste new resources? It is not clear where the bamboo resources used come from.

- The text should have a defined experimental section that states what and from where the materials were obtained, followed by the methodology.

- The results may be better set with their discussion.

- References should be written in the known format of the journal. Revise.

The text has to be refined and integrated to show cohesion.
